PRESIDENTS REPORT 2015-16

It is an honour and privilege to present to you my first annual report as President of Bowls Tasmania South.

I have had the pleasure of working with a highly dedicated and committed group of people who form the Board of Bowls Tasmania South. We have been faced with a number of difficult and challenging issues which, at times, has been the cause of lively debate but always in a manner respectful of fellow Board members. I am confident that in every case the Board's decisions have been fair and reasonable and in accordance with BTS Conditions of Play and the Laws of the Sport of Lawn Bowls.

Rob McGuire, BTS Secretary, has provided exemplary service to the Board, and to bowls generally in Southern Tasmania. Rob's knowledge and strong personal work ethic has ensured that he has provided information and documentation to the Board, and to all southern clubs, in a timely manner. I sincerely thank also Deputy President Shirley Hay for her support and commitment to representing the needs and concerns of the southern lawn bowls fraternity at meetings of the Bowls Tasmania Regional Consultative Committee. Tony Fulton, Treasurer, has performed admirably throughout the year. His monthly reports have been presented in a succinct, easily understood format which, at all times, represented Bowls Tasmania South's true financial position.

Unfortunately, the Chair of the Women's Match Committee, Jan Booth, retired from her Board position due to ill health. I thank Board member Ailsa Milburn for taking on this role, with support from the Secretary, completing all tasks assigned to her in a highly competent manner. Ross Bannister, Chair of the Men's Match Committee, was required to adjudicate on a number of issues relating to alleged contravention of BTS Conditions of Play by a number of clubs during the 2015-16 pennant season. Whilst the outcome of these appeals caused some angst for those clubs affected by his rulings, I believe that Ross' decisions, at all times, were correct and in accordance with the Conditions of Play and the Laws of the Sport of Lawn Bowl.

It is with pleasure that I offer congratulations to our Southern Representative sides for their success in retaining the Veolia Statewide Challenge Overall trophy, after our Women's Open, Men's Senior and Junior sides won their divisions of the Veolia Statewide Challenge. I thank all selectors for their fine efforts, and to all bowlers who made themselves available for selection.

Tony Kerrison, the Umpires Panel representative on the Board, is retiring from the position effective from the conclusion of the 2015-16 Board's year in office. I take this opportunity to thank Tony for his advice to the Board in regard to the laws of lawn bowl, and for his work in appointing umpires for BTS Pennant Finals, BTS Championship events, and Bowls Tasmania events hosted by BTS clubs. I wish Tony well for the future.

Congratulations, also, to Cam Tegg, for the completion of a magnificent season of lawn bowls. Cam has been rewarded for his efforts by being named not only BTS Men's Open Bowler of the Year, but Bowls Tasmania's Men's Bowler of the Year.

Well done to Jarrod Long for a spectacular post-season performance with the successful defense of his BTS Men's Singles Champion of Champions title, and then going on to win the title of Bowls Tasmania Men's Champion of Champions title, thus earning the right to represent Tasmania in the Bowls Australia Men's Champion of Champions event to be conducted later this year. Jarrod then participated in the Tasmanian Men's Indoor Open Singles Qualifiers winning this event also, and earning yet another trip to the mainland later in the year to represent Tasmania in the Australian Men's Indoor Open Singles event.

Congratulations to Oatlands Bowls Club, for being awarded the Fitzgerald trophy for the best-performed club for season 2015-16, qualifying its Saturday Pennant Division Three (pennant winner) and Six (pennant runner-up) for Saturday Pennant Grand Finals – a great effort for a small country club. Congratulations also to all other pennant winners in each of the BTS pennant competitions, and especially so to the Buckingham Premier Division side and the Sandy Bay Division One Women's Pennant side for winning their respective pennant competitions, the sixth year in succession for the Sandy Bay ladies.

After five previous attempts the Sandy Bay Women's Division One side finally achieved success at state level, winning the Thursday State Pennant Final. The Dover RSL's Women's Division Three side continued their success at state level, again taking out their Thursday State Pennant Final, this year winning the Division Three State Pennant. A great result for a country club, the result of strong recruiting, quality support and coaching provided to a number of their female member new to our sport. The Huonville Saturday Pennant Division Two side, after the completion of a very successful BTS pennant season, carried their good form on to state level, becoming the third of our sides to win their respective State Pennant title. Congratulations, all, for a great season of lawn bowls.

The additional funds raised through corporate sponsorship is a vital component in ensuring that Bowls Tasmania South is able to function in the most efficient manner. SOUTHERN COACHES REPORT

The season is over and if your bowls club does not have qualified bowls coachers then we need to talk to your committee and arrange coaches for your club. Every bowls club in the south should have at least two female and two male coaches in their club. If you would like to become a coach or know of somebody that would be a good lawn bowls coach please let me know and we can organise your registration through Bowls Tasmania for the next Southern Club Coaches course.

Last winter on the first Sunday in each month from May through to September training sessions were held at the Beltana Bowls Club on its synthetic green. There were two training sessions 9 am to 12 pm and from 12 pm to 3 pm. These training sessions have already been organised for this coming winter starting in May and finishing in September 2016 so come along and improve your game. It is open to everybody from beginners to Division 1 players.

On behalf of the coaches that assist with the training, I would like to thank the Beltana Bowls Club for opening their club on these Sundays and making it available for coaching sessions and allowing members from other bowls clubs to come and use their synthetic green at no cost.

The southern junior boys and girls also had training sessions over the summer month conducted by the Southern Junior Manager and Coach Tom O'Brien at the Buckingham Bowls Club.

Our Southern Coach's Committee members are more than happy to travel to any bowls club that needs help in running or organising bowls coaching sessions. If any clubs would like to organise a coaching day all they have to do is contact the Southern Coaches' Panel or myself.

SOUTHERN UMPIRES' PANEL REPORT

During the past year the Southern Umpires Panel continued to operate with three members namely Helen Ducker, Leonie Price and Tony Kerrison. The Panel met as necessary during the year and mainly dealt with appointments of officials (umpires, measurers and markers) for various Bowls Tasmania and Bowls Tasmania South events. Helen has also taken a proactive role in updating the Panels data base of all accredited Officials and contacting umpires due to reaccredit.

The year was one of consolidation of the revamped Officiating Structure. The Bowls Tasmania South Assessor/Presenter, Ross Bannister, ran a number of very successful Courses for Markers, Measurers, New Umpires and Reaccrediting Umpires. He was ably assisted by Panel members and some experienced umpires. Thank you Ross for the time and effort put into ensuring that Bowls Tasmania South has a substantial pool of Officials. Congratulations also to all candidates who successfully completed the courses.

Unfortunately there are still a number of clubs that do not have any accredited Officials and it places additional pressured on the current Officials when playing away games in pennant. The Panel asks that all clubs take action to have sufficient accredited Officials going forward.

At the beginning of the season the Panel held a forum for all Officials. This was well attended and a numbers of topics were discussed including the makeup of the current Officiating Structure, aspects of the various training courses and technical issues in interpreting the Laws of Bowls.

Another task undertaken by the Panel at the request of the Bowls Tasmania South Board was a review of all aspects of the Panels activities in light of the new structure. A comprehensive report was prepared and has been discussed and acted upon by the Board at a recent meeting.

Bowls Tasmania South hosted the Bowls Tasmania Championships it early January 2016 and a substantial number of experienced and new umpires, measurers and markers were appointed to officiate at the weeklong event. It was a great experience for all who participated. In addition umpires and markers were appointed to officiate at other State and Southern events enabling them to gain additional experience.

The Panel takes this opportunity to thank all umpires, measurers and markers for officiating in Pennant and Championship games during the past year. A special thank you also to our dedicated, hardworking Panel members for the time and effort they gave to ensuring all BTS officials maintain a high standard when officiating at all levels of the game.

The Secretary of the Panel, Tony Kerrison, has advised the Bowls Tasmania South Board that he will be resigning from the Panel at the end of this bowls year.

MEN'S SELECTION REPORT

Three rounds of the Veolia Statewide Challenge were conducted during the 2015-16 season with sponsorship monies available again from Veolia for each winner of the Men, Ladies, Juniors and Seniors (Over 60s) and also for the overall winner.

As in the previous season each region hosted a round of the Veolia Statewide Challenge although the Junior competition was centralised in Launceston. Host regions were required to field a second side and each team was obliged to include at least three players under 25 years of age. The Men's selectors were Tony Hack, Alex Stanelos and Grant Allford.

The first round of the Men's State Wide Challenge was conducted on the North West coast at Latrobe on 8 November 2015. The South met strong NW combinations in both games and, with one rink struggling badly on the day, lost both games, the first against NW2 by 4 shots and the second against NW1 by 21 shots. The South missed Rob McMullen who was unavailable and Cam Tegg who withdrew from representative games.

The second round was played at North Launceston on 17 January 2016. The selectors made changes after the first round and debuted two young players in Mitch Banks and Connor Munnings who both played well. The South won both games, the first against North 2 by 34 shots on all rinks, the second against North 1 by 6 shots with rinks shared.

The third and final round of the Veolia Statewide Challenge was conducted at Beltana on 14 February 2016 with mixed results. In the morning South 1 defeated NW by 9 shots while the North defeated South 2 comprehensively on all rinks by 24 shots. South 2 included many young players with the selectors keeping an eye on the future. In the afternoon South 1 went down to North by 5 shots despite winning on two rinks and South 2 upset the NW by 9 shots.

South finished the Statewide Challenge in second place behind the powerful North West team and showed significant improvement over the series. The decision to blood some new younger players paid dividends and we look forward to further improvement in 2016-17.

Combining the Men, Women, Junior's and Senior's results saw an overall Statewide Challenge win for the South.

Congratulations to all players who represented the South and thank you to managers, coaches and selectors and BTS for their time and effort.

Special Resolutions:

Moved Rob McGuire Seconded Ross Bannister that Section 19 of BTS Constitution as follows:

Delete from 19.1 the following words "Where a Club has both male and female Club Members, one delegate must be male and the other female." and replace with "The voting delegates shall be each Member Club's President and Secretary or their nominees."

This special resolution was carried by a majority of at least three quarters of the delegates present at the meeting.

Moved Rob McGuire Seconded Doug Lowe that the BTS Constitution be amended to add Section 43 as follows:

43. COMPLIANCE WITH BOWLS TASMANIA

The Association acknowledges and agrees that it shall:

(a) be or remain incorporated in Tasmania;

(b) provide Bowls Tasmania with copies of the Association's audited accounts, annual financial reports and other associated documents as soon as practicable, following the Association's annual general meeting;

(c) recognise Bowls Tasmania as the authority for Bowls in Tasmania and Bowls Australia as the national authority for Bowls;

(d) adopt and implement such communications and Intellectual Property policies as may be developed by Bowls Tasmania from time to time;

(e) have regard to the objects in any matter of the Association or Club pertaining to Bowls; and

(f) nominate a Delegate annually to attend Bowls Tasmania General Meetings (if entitled to do so), and shall inform Bowls Tasmania of the details of that person accordingly.

This special resolution was carried by a majority of at least three quarters of the delegates present at the meeting.

Appointment of Office Bearers:

President: 1 nomination – Peter Kirby Deputy President: 1 nomination – Shirley Hay Secretary: 1 nomination – Rob McGuire Treasurer: 1 nomination – Tony Fulton Executive Assistant: 1 nomination – Paul Hoddy Board members: 3 nominations – Paula Hadley, Nicholas Lee and Ailsa Milburn. All the above nominations were elected unopposed.

Nominations were called from the floor for the remaining vacant ordinary Board member – which if possible should be a male. No nominations were forthcoming so the incoming Board will appoint a person to fill the vacancy.

Non-Gender Specific Pennant 2015-16:

President Leigh McAdam advised that the BTS Board is still reviewing the results of the survey on nongender specific pennant. Full survey results have been sent to Clubs – which shows that almost 48% of BTS members answered the survey with responses from 26 of 28 clubs. Overall 60% of Clubs who responded and 52% of members support non-gender specific pennant. The BTS Board can announce that:

- Non-gender specific pennant will continue on Saturdays but the BTS Board is still looking at what conditions might apply;
- There will be minimal changes to Men's Midweek or Women's Thursday Pennant but the BTS Board has some issues to take to a future Delegates Meeting.

The Annual General Meeting was then closed at 2.35pm and President Leigh McAdam invited members to participate in the post meeting discussion with incoming President Peter Kirby.

Matters discussed at post meeting discussion chaired by new President Peter Kirby:

Thank You: Peter Kirby moved a vote of thanks to Past President Leigh McAdam for his contribution and efforts over the past twelve months.

Results in "The Mercury": A question was raised about the lack of results in "The Mercury" in the past season. Rob McGuire advised that the BTS Statistician did not have time to update results to the IMG Results Portal and prepare separate results for "The Mercury" as well The BTS Board has provided a separate honorarium in 2015-16 to enable "The Mercury" results to happen again.

Non-Gender Specific Pennant: Robert Davies (Cygnet) asked what limitations there will be on A Grade Thursday Women playing Saturday Pennant in 2015-16. Leigh McAdam advised that this was still being considered by the BTS Board.

Pam Cooper (Claremont) asked what impact the Saturday Pennant Action Group's Saturday men's only social bowls will have on Saturday Pennant. Rob McGuire advised that Clubs are submitting similar team numbers to last season which suggests that it will have minimum impact, however, this will not be really known until final team numbers are confirmed a week before pennant starts.

Alan Rider (Cremorne) asked if the Challenger League will be renamed next season. Leigh McAdam confirmed that the Challenger League will be renamed to Division 7 next season but will remain as 12 players only. Alan Rider also asked if Pennant starting times can be changed. Rob McGuire confirmed that they can with the consent of both Clubs and the relevant BTS Match Committee.

Rod Purcell (Sorell) asked if Clubs were able to quantify the number of new members they had obtained as a result of the move to non-gender specific pennant last season. Rob McGuire advised that Clubs have never been asked for this information by BTS.

Pennant Starting Times: Charon Foster (Howrah) suggested that Thursday Women's Pennant should start at the same time as Wednesday Midweek and Saturday Pennant. Rob McGuire advised that this had recently been considered by the BTS Board when it was agreed that the starting time would remain unchanged.

Doug Lowe (Glenorchy City) suggested that consideration should be given to starting all Pennant earlier than is currently the case to avoid the afternoon heat.

Peter Kirby thanked Glenorchy City for the use of their Club for the meeting. He also thanked everyone for attending and wished them all the best for the coming season.

Meeting closed at 2.55pm.
