PRESIDENTS REPORT

I am pleased to be given the opportunity to present to you my third annual report as President of Bowls Tasmania South (BTS).

I have the privilege of leading a strong, cohesive unit, always committed to advancing the sport of bowls in our region. The decisions of the Board may not always please everyone but each matter resolved by the Board has been determined through consistent application of the laws of bowls, the various policies applicable to the question being discussed, and any relevant sections of BTS' Conditions of Play. Most importantly, each member of the Board has a strong understanding that they are managing the association's affairs on behalf of the members (the affiliated clubs and their registered playing members) and do so without regard for the interests of their own club. I am humbled and honoured to have the privilege of working with such a group of dedicated people.

During the 2017-18 year, the BTS Board has taken a strong, leadership role on a number of matters of keen interest to affiliated clubs and their members. Firstly, after submissions from a number of clubs, and Board member Malcolm Salier's sponsorship, the Board has requested Bowls Tasmania (BTAS) to investigate the introduction of fixed fee capitation fees. It is hoped that procedures for the adoption of fixed fee capitation fees for Tasmania will be debated and approved during the 2018-19 year. BTAS's decision to adopt fixed fee capitation fees will enable BTS to invoice each affiliated club a single, fixed fee capitation charge rather than the current annual capitation fee for each playing member registered with the club.

Secondly, BTS has progressed the idea of uniform, consistent conditions of play, state wide, to the point that a working party has been formed, consisting of Rob McGuire (non-voting Chair) and two representatives from each of the three regions. The working party will be active during the winter months with the hope that decisions will be made in time to affect each region's conditions of play prior to the commencement of the 2018-19 pennant season. Of course, any progress on this vital matter relies on good will and a commitment to compromise to ensure good outcomes. BTS has committed to accept the decision of the majority (i.e. two of the three regions being in agreement on an issue) to enable the process to reach fruition.

Thirdly, in response to clubs' and registered players' concerns in regard to the commencing date for the pennant season and its early closure (especially for the most recent season) BTS initiated discussion with BTAS at a Regional Consultative Committee meeting early in the season in regard to taking steps to enable the season to conclude in late March/April each year. Currently, BTAS nominates the weekend before Good Friday to schedule its Saturday Pennant State Finals events. In response, BTAS is investigating the possibility of using Anzac Day each year to determine the dates for its state pennant finals events as this would provide greater consistency. It would also enable the regions to investigate a later start for their own pennant competitions. The only foreseeable problem is an alignment with Bowls Australia's (BA) calendar of events.

The recently completed player survey has given BTS valuable data to assist in its negotiations with the other regions in regard to consistent, state wide conditions of play. A massive 89% of respondents has endorsed BTS's initiative to engage with the other regions to achieve this outcome. While BTS's representatives on the working party will use other data from the survey as a starting point on those matters, it must be accepted by all registered players in southern Tasmania that it may not be possible to achieve desired outcomes on all issues, if our main aim of consistent, state wide conditions of play is to be achieved.

In response to an initiative of Board member Ken Coppleman, a seminar for club treasurers was conducted during the early part of the season. The BTS Board is most appreciative of the extent of the preparation undertaken by the presenter, Deb Jeffrey (Treasurer, Beltana Bowls Club) and to the Beltana Bowls Club for providing the venue. Deb provided on-point, appropriate information and guidance for the many club treasurers who attended the evening, which would enable each of them to improve their effectiveness.

The success of this initial information session has encouraged the Board to provide further sessions during the forthcoming season, especially in regard to governance issues. BA has identified governance at all levels as a matter of grave importance with which BTS agrees, and is very keen to ensure that management of its affiliated clubs align to best practice and appropriate management principles. While Sport and Recreation sponsors an annual one-off governance seminar, the Board believes that a series of focused workshops would be more beneficial to club management. Initially, the theme of the workshops will be determined by the Board but further topics may be generated by the clubs.

BA policies are binding on all levels of the sport of bowls in Australia but two in particular have been a focus for BTS in recent times, those being BA's Greens Protection and Member Protection Policies. Greens are the core material asset of all clubs and, whether grass or artificial surfaces, the most expensive to repair and replace. The Greens Protection Policy has implications for BTS's Conditions of Play and, consequently, for its affiliated clubs. The core of the BA Member Protection Policy is the health and wellbeing of club members and endeavours to create an environment free of harassment and discrimination. Club administrations are encouraged to create their own member protection policies (a club template is available on the Australian Sports Commission website), as well as a code of behaviour for their members. This will provide surety to members in regard to acceptable behaviour as well as a range of sanctions that could apply should it be proven that they have acted contrary to their club's member protection policy and code of conduct.

A Member Protection Information Officer (MPIO) has a very important role to play in the mediation process associated with the grievance, investigative and disciplinary processes associated with the Member Protection Policy and the *Play by the Rules* website has an online training course for people interested in becoming an MPIO. The BTS Board is concerned that too few MPIO's are available to clubs and individual members in the southern part of the state and has engaged clubs recently to seek assistance in developing more members to attain qualifications so that a register of accredited MPIO's can be established on the BTS website.

It was with great pleasure to be able to welcome Rebecca van Asch, BTAS CEO, to the recent BTS Annual Presentation Night, and have the opportunity to congratulate her on her double gold medal achievement at the Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast. The BTS Board has resolved to take full advantage of the heightened exposure of bowls, due mainly to Rebecca's achievements, to promote the sport of bowls through a media advertising campaign. The Board is most hopeful that all of its affiliated clubs will participate in this promotion during the winter months to grow the sport in our region.

Congratulations to all 2017-18 pennant winners, especially to Glenorchy Rodman (Premier Division), Howrah (Saturday Division 1), and Oatlands (Saturday Division 5) for winning their division of BTAS's State Pennant Finals, as well as to Sandy Bay's Thursday Division 1 side on winning their BTS division pennant for the eighth consecutive season. Congratulations, also, to the Glenorchy City Bowls Club for winning the Fitzgerald trophy for Club of the Year, a feat that the club also achieved in the previous season. Fine individual performances have also been achieved by Kaye Clifford (Howrah) and Brad Johns (Franklin), BTS B Grade Bowlers of the Year, and Denise Tanner (Howrah) and Lee Schraner (Rosny Park), BTS Open Bowlers of the Year.

Lee Schraner extended his excellent individual performance in defending both his BTS and BTAS Champion of Champions Men's Open Singles titles. Lee is also the current BA Champion of Champions Men's Open Singles title holder and will contest the World Bowls Champion of Champions event later in the year.

Lauren Banks, of New Norfolk, continued her good form from her success in the BTS Champion of Champions Women's Open Singles event to take out the BTAS Champion of Champions Women's Open title as well, an outstanding achievement for a bowler still in the junior ranks. We wish Lee and Lauren success in the BA Champion of Champions Open Singles events, to be contested in Tasmania in early October. 2018

Currently, BTS is experiencing difficulty in attracting corporate sponsorship of our sport in southern Tasmania. No doubt many of our clubs are encountering the same dilemma when seeking assistance in staging their open tournaments. BTS's major sponsor for many years, DJ Motors, ended its partnership with the association during the season, after protracted negotiations. BTS is grateful, though, to Doug Cole for his continued support of the BTS junior development program. This latter program is proving to be a great success with half of the BTAS junior training squad being from southern clubs. Doug's commitment to the future of our sport, through his generous contributions to our juniors, is very much appreciated by the Board, as is the great work of our junior mentor, Tom O'Brien.

At the end of my third year as President, Bowls Tasmania South, I am extremely proud of the achievements of the Board. Bowls Tasmania South is making great efforts to counter the parochialism that has plagued our sport for so long by engaging with Bowls Tasmania (rather than being aggressively oppositional), and by taking a mature leading role in developing partnerships with our colleagues in other regions – all for the betterment of the bowls environment statewide. I look forward to the 2018-19 season with the real hope that regional conditions of play will have greater consistency, especially for pennant competitions that may lead to State Pennant Finals conducted by BTAS.

SOUTHERN COACHES PANEL REPORT

Last winter on the first Sunday in each month from May through to September coaching sessions were held at the new Howrah Indoor Bowls Centre. On behalf of the coaches that assisted with the training, I would like to thank the Howrah Bowls Club for opening their club on these Sundays and making it available for the coaching sessions and allowing members from other bowls clubs to come and use their indoor centre.

These winters coaching sessions have already been organised for this coming winter and will be again at the Howrah Indoor Bowls Centre starting on the first Sunday of each month in May to September from 12 noon to 3 pm, so come along and improve your game, it is open to everybody from beginners to Premier players. Bowls Tasmania South is covering the cost of the indoor centre so it is free to all participants at these coaching sessions.

The southern junior boys and girls also had training sessions over the summer month conducted by the Bowls Tasmania South Junior Selector and Coach Tom O'Brien at the Buckingham Bowls Club.

Our southern coach's committee members are more than happy to travel to any bowls club that needs help in running or organising bowls coaching sessions. If any clubs would like to organise a coaching day all they have to do is contact the Southern coaches' panel or myself.

Last year and again this year most of our southern coach's certification has or will expire. It is very simple to be requalified as a club coach by having your bowls club write a current competent letter saying that you have been actively coaching at your bowls club, fill out an application form, supplying a photo copy of your working with vulnerable people card and watch the coach's videos on the Bowls Australia web site. The re-certification fee is \$25.00 to cover the cost of a new certification card. Not many of our coaches in the south have reaccredited which is very disappointing.

Some bowls clubs have had unqualified people coaching at pennant games. This is a breach of coaching principals and leaves the bowls club liable if something happens. So if you want to coach why not register in a coach's course.

If your bowls club does not have qualified bowls coachers, you need to talk to your clubs bowls committee and arrange to get qualified. Every bowls club in the south should have at least two female and two male coaches in their club. If you would like to become a coach or know of somebody that would be a good lawn bowls coach please let me know and we can organise your registration through Bowls Tasmania for the next Southern Clubs Coaches course.

OFFICIATING' PANEL REPORT

The Bowls Tasmania South Officiating Panel have had a successful season and look forward to continuing to be a supportive and helpful body to all bowlers and administrators in the South.

Although the 'Side Captains Guidelines' had been updated there are several issues that are not being addressed by clubs:

- The Conditions of Play state that the timing of the greens must be 20 minutes before play commences and both Side Captains should participate.
- The Guidelines also expect Side Captains to check that their players are correctly attired as per Condition 1.8. This means that the Bowls Australia Logo Policy (Dress Regulations) will apply to all persons playing in BTS Championships and pennant competitions.
- The Conditions of Play requirement that if there is not a currently accredited umpire, at the host club, then a visiting currently accredited umpire must be used has not been followed in some instances.
- There also has to be a reminder to clubs that the Side Captain (Match Manager), the Green Superintendent or nominated representative may not be the Umpire.

The BTS website has been updated and clubs are able to access lists of Officials, Measurers and Markers to assist with the conduct of events held at their clubs.

The program of producing new Officials continues and thanks go to the untiring efforts of Ross Bannister.

Forums for Umpires and Measurers were held in the South, North and Eastern areas of the South and the regionalisation proved to be successful. Next season this program will continue and all qualified Officials are encouraged to attend to update their knowledge, especially when there have been changes to either the Laws or the Conditions of Play.

There will also be regional opportunities for all Officials and Measurers to update their skills with daytime on the green measuring forums.

My thanks go to the Bowls Tasmania South Officiating Panel of Helen Ducker, Lee Cowie and Geoff Price and to the numerous Officials that have given their time to BTS Championship events and Pennant Finals.

MEN'S OPEN SELECTION REPORT

The BTS Selectors for 2017-18 were Wayne Lampkin, Barry Nash and Darren Monks (Chairman of Selectors BTS and Bowls Tasmania Selector).

As Selectors the emphasis was on seeing an improvement in the playing group from the previous year and, in general, it was pleasing to see an overall improvement in the performance of the team over the three rounds of the Statewide Challenge. Compared to the other regions, we continue to be frustrated by the lack of availability of some of the better players in the South, but our emphasis on giving some of our younger players a chance has started to reap benefits.

Round 1: Statewide Challenge – North Launceston Bowls Club

The first game in the morning was against North 2. Lee Schraner v Adam Gurr. With Adam Gurr playing well they got off to a 3/15 start after 9 ends. Lee Schraner put down some big bowls which changed the momentum, resulting in a draw at the end of play 17-17. The second game was Taelyn Male v Daniel Baker. With David Douce leading well, Bryce Guy putting plenty of bowls in the head and Keghan Booth consistently never leaving the skip in trouble and skip Taelyn Male converting well they had an overall win 21-13. The third game Josh Mabb v Gene Ayton. With Mitch Banks leading, Peter Bannister 2, Josh Baker 3 and Josh Mabb as skip, the rink generally played well and they had an overall win 20-11.

In the afternoon Bowls South v Bowls North 1 was played off in blustery conditions. Lee Schraner v Michael Sims with Sims' rink playing well they defeated Schraner's rink 18-16. Michael Sweeney played a solid match. Taelyn Male v Timmy Douce. With good bowls in the head from both teams resulted in Male just falling short by 2 shots. Josh Mabb v Robert McMullen - McMullen's rink played very well defeating Mabb 13-26.

Overall Bowls South defeated Bowls North 2, 58-41. Overall Bowls North defeated Bowls South 59-42 with 3 rinks losing.

Round 2: Statewide Challenge - Latrobe Bowls Club

Selectors made some changes across the rinks. With Brad Griffiths moving interstate and Scott Summers moving south, he filled that position. Peter Bannister moved to the 3 spot for Lee Schraner who had a good overall win against Mark Nitz 22-7. It was a brilliant game from Michael Sweeney, a solid match from Peter Bannister and Lee Schraner doing what he does best. Josh Mabb v Luke Richardson with Luke Turner and Connor Munnings 2 spot and Paul Williamson playing 3 they were defeated 20-8. Taelyn Male v David Gamble with Gamble winning 16-10. With the North West 1 winning on two rinks they took the points by 3 shots overall.

In the afternoon game South v North West 2 on a 19 second green - Josh Mabb v C. Willcox with Josh Mabb winning 21-9. Taelyn Male v J. Turner with Male winning in a tight game 12-11. Lee Schraner v A. Johns in a tight game with A. Johns prevailing by just the 1 shot 14-15.

Overall Bowls North West defeated Bowls South, 43-40. Bowls South defeated North West 2 overall with the score being 47-35

Round 3: Statewide Challenge - Buckingham Bowls Club

First game South 1 v North West 1 played on the artificial surface. Lee Schraner defeated Luke Richardson 20-15. Taelyn Male v Mark Nitz with Male winning 15-12. With a new skip Paul Williamson v Patrick Smith losing 13-15. South winning on two rinks 48-42.

South 2 v North - Mitchell Banks v Tim Douce lost 19-25. Mick Taylor v Robert McMullen with Taylor winning 20-15. Brett Forsyth v Michael Sims, with Sims prevailing 17-12. Overall Score Bowls South 2, 51-57 Bowls North.

In the afternoon game with the overall competition any of the three regions could win the Statewide Challenge with Bowls South having to win four rinks to take the overall trophy.

Bowls South was defeated by Bowls North with Lee Schraner playing Tim Douce, with Douse winning 21-15. Taelyn Male v Michael Sims having a draw 18-18. Paul Williamson v Robert McMullen with McMullen winning 22-20. Overall shots 53-61, with Bowls North winning on two and half rinks.

Bowls South 2 versus the North West with Connor Munnings v Mark Nitz, with Munnings winning 16-12. Michael Taylor v Luke Richardson, with Richardson winning 25-11. Grant Wakefield v Patrick Smith, with Smith winning 15-11. The North West won overall 52-38, two rinks to one.

The North West 1 was relying on Bowls South to beat North only on three rinks. The North West could have taken the title, but Bowls North prevailed in the end to take the overall title for the second year running. Congratulations to Bowls North for winning and North West finishing second.

MINUTES – 2016-17 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Attendance and Apologies: There were 38 delegates from 22 clubs and 21 others in attendance. Apologies were received from Cremorne and Franklin, Life Member Hedley Beechey, Board Members Ken Coppleman and Leonie Price and John Clark (Glenorchy Rodman).

Recognition of deceased members: All members stood for a short period of silence in recognition of those members who had passed away during the preceding year.

Minutes of last preceding AGM: Moved Robert Davies Seconded Ailsa Milburn that the minutes of the AGM held on 29 May 2016, as circulated, be accepted as read and confirmed.

Carried.

Annual Report and Financial Report:

The President, Peter Kirby, spoke to his report, as published within the Annual Report, and expanded on some points. Moved Peter Kirby Seconded Paula Hadley "that the annual report be received".

Carried

With the assistance of Secretary, Rob McGuire, the Treasurer, Tony Fulton, presented his financial report and the audited financial statements. Moved Tony Fulton Seconded Van Ransley "that the audited financial statements be adopted".

Recommendations from the Board:

Appointment of Patron: Moved Ailsa Milburn Seconded Gail Price "that Joan Middleton OAM be appointed as Patron.

Carried

Appointment of Auditor: Moved Leigh McAdam Seconded Shirley Hay "that Rendell Ridge of Max Peck & Associates be re-appointed as auditor". Carried.

Affiliation Fees: Moved Rob McGuire Seconded Paula Hadley "that affiliation fees for 2017-18 for adult members be increased by \$2.00 to \$74.00, that the affiliation fee for juniors be increased by \$2.00 to \$38.00, that the registration fee of \$50.00 per team remain unchanged and that entry fees for BTS Championships remain unchanged at \$10.00.

Carried.

Equal Opportunity Tasmania and Thursday Pennant Finals: Equal Opportunity Tasmania has advised BTS that it has received a complaint claiming discrimination against male bowlers who only have one opportunity to compete in State Pennant Finals whereas women have the opportunity of competing in two State Pennant Finals. Equal Opportunity Tasmania has further advised that BTS is possibly in breach of the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1988 (Tas.)* because of this. BTS has been given the opportunity to address this matter itself but risks having the matter referred to the Anti-Discrimination Tribunal whose decision will be mandatory for BTS to follow. It would appear that BTS may be in breach of the Act. The BTS Board submitted the following five options for consideration of Clubs:

- Change Saturday Pennant back to men only.
- Change Thursday Women's Pennant to open gender.
- No longer participate in Bowls Tasmania Thursday State Pennant Finals.
- Retain the status quo and accept the decision of the Anti-Discrimination Tribunal.
- Limit all players to one state final per pennant season.

The BTS Board recommended to Clubs that they consider no longer participating in Bowls Tasmania Thursday State Pennant Finals.

Phil Hobbs advised that Sandy Bay was of the opinion that BTS should maintain the status quo and seek legal advice to defend its position with Equal Opportunity Tasmania.

Moved: Vere Ransley Seconded: Rod Cooper "that BTS advises Equal Opportunity Tasmania that it couldn't reach agreement on this matter and ask Equal Opportunity Tasmania to rule on it". This motion was withdrawn by the mover with the support of the seconder.

Moved: Kim Spencer Seconded: Shirley Hay "that BTS limit all players to one state final per pennant season"

Lost

Clubs were then asked to vote to indicate their support for the five options presented to them. Clubs were requested to vote for one option only. The results were as follows:

- Change Saturday Pennant back to men only 0 votes.
- Change Thursday Women's Pennant to open gender 13 votes.
- No longer participate in Bowls Tasmania Thursday State Pennant Finals 17 votes.
- Retain the status quo and accept the decision of the Anti-Discrimination Tribunal 2 votes.
- Limit all players to one state final per pennant season -0 votes.

Accordingly the majority votes from Clubs supported the BTS Board recommendation that Clubs no longer participate in Bowls Tasmania Thursday State Pennant Finals.

Minimum Eligibility Games Requirement for Pennant Finals: The BTS Board sought input from Clubs on how many games, if any, Clubs want built into Conditions of Play 3.23 (c) for 2017-18. Current BTS Conditions of Play 3.23 (c) provides the following eligibility requirements to play in Pennant finals:

No one shall play in finals of Pennant for a Club in a competition unless they have played at least six completed roster games in that competition during the season in any of the divisions except in exceptional circumstances (confined only to a medical condition) approved by the Chair of the BTS Match Committee.

Moved: Rod Cooper Seconded: Craig Griggs "that Condition 3.23(c) be amended to read as follows in 2017-18:

No one shall play in finals of Pennant for a Club in a competition unless they have played at least six completed games for that Club in that competition and have played in that division except in exceptional circumstances as approved by the BTS President or his delegate."

Amendment Moved: Jenny Whitworth Seconded: Kim Spencer "that "six" be changed to "four: and the words "at least one game" be added before the words "in that division".

Format of Midweek Pennant 2017-18: The BTS Board sought input from Clubs on the format of Midweek Pennant for 2017-18. There is an argument that Wednesday Midweek Pennant is more of a social pennant than not and the main reason for that argument is that BTS Conditions of Play require that each rink for Midweek Pennant contain at least two B Grade players in it. The following options were submitted to Clubs for their consideration:

- Retain the status quo with the requirement that each rink contain at least two B Grade players in it

Matter discussed at post meeting discussion chaired by President Peter Kirby:

Bowls Premier League Cup: Simon Morrison, Bowls Australia's Regional Bowls Manager (Tasmania) spoke on the inaugural Bowls Premier League (BPL) Cup which commences in July 2017. Over the past four years, Bowls Australia has successfully staged five Bowls Premier League events and in late 2014 launched Jack Attack, a national participation program. The creation of the BPL Cup is an initiative to help to marry the two products together to strengthen the correlation between the bowls that viewers see on television and the format of bowls that is offered at local clubs. The BPL Cup will target existing registered bowlers (full or social bowlers) and provide them with a new competition format that will complement the other formats of the sport. The BPL Cup will provide an opportunity for club based teams to progress through various stages to a national final which will be played as part of the BPL06 competition in November, 2017.

The competition format will be two bowl triples and will follow the same rules as the BPL competition. The Southern Tasmanian competition will be staged at the Howrah Indoor Centre in July 2017 with winners to progress though to a state final. The victorious team from each state will then be invited to Club Pine Rivers in Brisbane to play off in the national final, with the victorious team to be crowned the National BPL Cup champions.

Cost is \$50 per team (of three players who must all be from the same Club). \$10 per team will be paid to all host clubs and all food and beverage sales will be retained by the host clubs. All entrants will be responsible for their own costs to attend the local and state finals with Bowls Australia covering travel and accommodation costs to attend the national final.

Peter Kirby thanked Beltana for the use of their Club for the meeting. He also thanked everyone for attending and wished them all the best for the coming season.
