## **PRESIDENTS REPORT**

It has been a distinct pleasure to be the President of Bowls Tasmania South (BTS) during a stellar season for the Association and, in particular, its affiliated clubs.

The 2018-19 season commenced with Kingborough Bowls and Community Club hosting Bowls Australia's Champion of Champions Singles in early October 2018. What better start to the season could bowls in the south have had! This was an opportunity to demonstrate to the bowls community Australia-wide the ability to organise and conduct major bowls events in our region and the Kingborough Committee and its members achieved this in superlative fashion. The strong support of this event by the southern bowls community over the three days of the event, and especially the final day, had a significant and very positive impact on our mainland visitors. It didn't hurt that Lee Schraner, from Rosny Park, won the men's event undefeated (and for the second consecutive year), and Lauren Banks from New Norfolk (and still a junior!), won all but one of her matches, losing her final match to the eventual Bowls Australia Women's Singles Champion of Champions, Kylie Whitehead (Victoria).

In December 2018, Sandy Bay Bowls Club hosted the French Holbrook test series (Tasmania v. Victoria). The quality of the management of this prestigious event by members of the Sandy Bay Club further emphasised the ability of our clubs to conduct major events.

Rosny Park Bowls Club took on the role of host club for Bowls Tasmania's Gala Week in early January 2019, supported by Buckingham, Claremont and Kingborough. A highlight, again, was the quality of organisation at all four clubs – and the excellent weather which ensured that all greens were presented in the best possible condition. The management team at Rosny Park, in particular, put in long hours each day for the duration of Gala Week to ensure that all matches each day proceeded seamlessly. Bowls Tasmania is to be congratulated for extending the program for Gala Week to include events for Bowlers with a Bowling Arm and Bowlers with a Disability. The very positive reaction of the able bowlers to their inclusion in Gala Week was most impressive.

Bowls Australia prides itself in bowls being an inclusive sport, available to all players of all abilities. Bowls is probably one of the few sports where men and women, both able and with a disability, can compete together. Are we in southern Tasmania doing enough to embrace diversity and inclusivity? The low number of entries from southern clubs in the Bowlers with a Disability events during Gala Week would suggest not. Perhaps this is an untapped resource to increase membership.

Congratulations to all pennant winning sides for 2018-19, in Saturday Pennant: Premier Division: Kingborough (and State Pennant winners), Division 1: Dover RSL (And State Pennant winners), Division 2: Sandy Bay (missing out on their Division State Pennant on a countback), Division 3: Beltana, Division 4: Howrah (and State Pennant winners), Division 5: Howrah, Division 6: Glenorchy City (and State Pennant winners), and Division 7: Dover RSL. In Thursday Women's Pennant Sandy Bay won their ninth Division 1 pennant in succession, a truly magnificent achievement. If that was not enough this side went on to win the Division 1 Thursday State Pennant as well. Just to show that they would not be outdone by their "big sisters" Sandy Bay's Thursday Pennant Division 2 side completed the "double" as well, winning their divisional pennant and then winning the Thursday State Pennant. Congratulations to Claremont for winning the Division 3 pennant, Sandy Bay for their success in winning the Division 4 pennant, and to Huonville for winning the Division 5 pennant. In Men's Midweek Pennant congratulations to the divisional winners: New Norfolk (division 1), Beltana (Division 2), Beltana (Division 3) and Sorell (Division). A sincere "thank you" to all clubs that made their greens available to host matches during the finals series for all three of Bowls Tasmania South's' pennant competitions.

Congratulations to Oatlands Bowls Club, the BTS Bowls Club of the Year for 2018-19. Lyn Triffitt (New Norfolk), Women's Open Singles and Pairs Champion, as well as Bowls Tasmania's Women's Singles Champion of Champions (after previously winning the Bowls Tasmania South Women's Open Singles Champion of Champions event), capped off an excellent season of bowls by being named Bowls Tasmania South's Women's Bowler of the Year. Her partner in the Bowls Tasmania's Women's Pairs triumph, Jenny Tirant (Rosny Park), was also a member of the composite team that won the Bowls Tasmania's Women's Open Triples title.

Other southern bowlers who had success in state events were Paul Williamson (Beltana) and Connor Munnings (Rosny Park) who won the Men's Open Pairs, and Lee Schraner (Rosny Park) and Brad Johns (Franklin) who were southern members of the composite team that won the Men's Open Fours title. Congratulations to Taelyn Male (Kingborough) who brought to an end Lee Schraner's dominance of the Bowls Tasmania South's Men's Singles Champion of Champions event when he defeated Lee in the final, with both bowlers playing some brilliant shots in spite of the very cold and wet night at Buckingham.

It is also important to acknowledge the success of our junior bowlers during Gala Week. Lauren Banks (New Norfolk) and Jorja Maughan (Buckingham) were rewarded for foregoing their junior event when they were very credible runners up in the Bowls Tasmania's Women's Open Pairs event, losing a tight game to Lyn Triffitt and Jenny Tirant. Lauren was successful in winning the Bowls Tasmania's Junior Girls' Singles title, with Isaac Maughan (Buckingham) winning the Junior Boys Singles title from club mate Lucas Howell. Kingborough cousins, Blake and Noah Sculthorpe, won the Junior Boys' Pairs event.

Congratulations to our elite bowlers who participated in the three rounds of Bowls Tasmania's Men's and Women's State Wide Challenge (Open, Senior's and Junior's), in particular to the Women's Open side which won their section of the Challenge. The performance of the five other southern State Wide Challenge sides, although not winning their event, performed sufficiently well enough to ensure that Bowls Tasmania South was named overall winners of the Bowls Tasmania's State Wide Challenge competition for 2018-19 - a magnificent achievement!

Dover RSL Bowls Club continues to demonstrate how a small club in a remote location can survive and flourish in spite of their isolation, adopting a "self-help" attitude rather than allowing their isolation limit their expectations. Over recent years the club has been able to increase their membership to the point that the club now fields two sides in the Women's Thursday Pennant, as well as two sides in the Saturday Pennant, both of the latter two also winning their respective 2018-19 divisional pennant, with their Saturday Division 1 side also gaining promotion to Premier Division for 2019-20. The clearest possible indication of the club's positive attitude to the development of their facilities is their recent success in obtaining a Federal Government grant that will enable the installation of a synthetic green in time for the commencement of the 2019-20 pennant season. No doubt this will have flow-on benefits to the club in the recreational services that they can provide to their community, as well as the opportunity to further develop the playing skills of current and future members.

During 2018-19 the Bowls Tasmania South Board adopted a conciliatory approach to interaction with representatives of Bowls Tasmania and the other regions in an effort to develop consistent statewide conditions of play for pennant competitions. The Board was willing to accept the majority decision on all matters, even if this meant a change to local Conditions of Play to achieve our aim. Because Bowls Tasmania South and Bowls North West both supported Saturday Pennant of sides consisting of four rinks, forming a majority vote on this central issue, and Bowls Tasmania North not being able to comply all further discussion on consistent statewide conditions of play ceased, and Bowls Tasmania has abandoned any further attempts to progress this matter.

Bowls Tasmania had already decided not to pursue any possibility of consistent statewide conditions of play for Thursday Pennant in full knowledge of the position of Bowls Tasmania South and Bowls North West on this pennant being a competition for female bowlers, and Bowls North not being able to restructure their Thursday Pennant from open gender to a single gender (female) competition.

Bowls Australia has confirmed the rescheduling of all of its major events (except for the Australian Open) into “The Nationals”, incorporating the Australian Sides Championships, Australian Under 18, Australian Champion of Champions Singles, Australian Senior Sides, Awards Night and Hall of Fame, to be conducted over a two week period in October each year, commencing in 2020 (3-16 October, 2020). Bowls Australia proposes that as many as nine different events could be conducted over this two week period in October each year.

The rescheduling of the Australian Sides Championships from April to October each year, in particular, has enabled Bowls Tasmania to alter its program of events so that its annual State Pennant Finals series can be conducted later, using Anzac Day as the termination point rather than Easter as was previously the case. This has been an issue that Bowls Tasmania South has been promoting for some time and its gratifying that Bowls Tasmania has acceded to our representations on this matter. With Bowls Tasmania State Pennant Finals scheduled for the week ending Sunday 19 April, 2020, Bowls Tasmania South will be able to commence its pennant season in late October each year, on a permanent basis.

The use of social media, especially Facebook, is a growing phenomenon for informal exchange of ideas and opinions. Bowls Tasmania South is most grateful to David Genford for his personal commitment to the management of the BTS Facebook page over many years and is saddened by the manner in which he ceased his involvement. This highlights the need for procedures to be put in place to ensure that all posts to the BTS Facebook page are respectful and devoid of any material that could cause hurt or harm.

At each Annual General Meeting of Bowls Tasmania South, four board members, two female and two male, are elected. The four incumbents, Paula Hadley, Ailsa Milburn, Malcolm Salier and Ken Copleman are strong advocates for their fellow bowlers striving always to provide the best of possible outcomes for all clubs and their bowling members in southern Tasmania. While a number of positions on the Board, with specific roles designated to each, either by election or nomination (i.e. a nominated representative of the BTS Officiating Panel), the four elected “ordinary” Board members do not have any specific role assigned to them. This is not good governance practice and when the 2019-20 Bowls Tasmania South Board is assembled each of the four “ordinary” Board members will be given responsibility for the management and coordination of specific activities related to the Bowls Tasmania South Strategic Plan. This will ensure that the intentions of the Strategic Plan will have ongoing oversight as well as ongoing reporting of progress to the Board.

For several years southern bowls officials (umpires, markers and measurers) have been supported by the BTS Officiating Panel, consisting of Leonie Price (Chair), Geoff Price, Lee Cowie, Helen Ducker, and Ross Bannister (Assessor/Presenter). Much of the Officiating Panel’s work has been taken up with the appointment of officials for the finals of Bowls Tasmania South championship events and pennant finals. With Bowls Tasmania’s Gala Week in Hobart in January this year their task also included appointment of all officials to all venues for the entire week. Leonie and her panel are to be commended for the quality of the appointments they have made.

It is in the conduct of workshops and forums to assist officials to maintain and improve their levels of competency that the BTS Officiating Panel does its best work. While Ross Bannister works diligently to provide instruction to bowlers seeking accreditation as markers, measurers and umpires, it is through participation in the forums sponsored by the Officiating Panel that ensures that Ross’ initial input results in quality, informed practitioners. The BTS Officiating Panel also performs a very important role in the interpretation of points of law and, in this regard, it has been a most valuable asset.



Whilst Bowls Tasmania South is satisfied that it has a quality resource in the form of its Officiating Panel, the same cannot be claimed for the wider Tasmanian bowls community. Although it is pleasing to note that Bowls Tasmania will be reconstituting its Officiating Committee after its annual general meeting in late May, this body has not functioned in any form for a number of years. In the past Bowls Tasmania South has made attempts to have Bowls Tasmania reform this constitutionally binding committee, but without success. The great hope is that with this committee fully functional there will be greater consistency of officiating at major events in every region of the state.

I am pleased to be supported by a very competent Executive Committee. Vice President Pat Zapotocky, new to the position in 2018-19, has developed into a valuable member of the team. Secretary Rob McGuire is an immense asset to Bowls Tasmania South through his efficient approach to tasks, as well as to the quality of his output. Rob certainly contributes many hours of service to the Association well beyond that which should be expected. Rob has the ability to provide sage advice to the Board, and to me personally, which inevitably leads to better decisions. A capable treasurer is essential to the successful management of any sporting body and the southern bowls community is especially fortunate in having Life Member Tony Fulton in the position of Bowls Tasmania South Treasurer. Tony encourages the endorsement of conservative budgets which, in times of limited access to corporate sponsorship, sometimes require difficult decisions to reduce expenditure to achieve a balanced budget.

The completion of a successful season relies on many factors, but most importantly upon the degree to which members of the Association volunteer their services to officiate at major events, or as match managers and working in the kitchen preparing meals. Everyone who has volunteered in these roles has enhanced the quality of the experience for all those who have participated in those events. Finally, I acknowledge those who have volunteered in the role of Bowls Tasmania South Selector, Coach or Manager for the various State Wide Challenge sides. Often, in celebrating the success of our elite bowlers we forget about the other people, the selectors, coaches and managers, who helped make it happen.

In some ways 2018-19 has been quite challenging, but it has also provided many highlights, and it is better to focus on the latter and celebrate rather than dwell on the former. I have been heartened by the support that I have received from many people during this season and, with your endorsement, I hope to provide further service to Bowls Tasmania South, its affiliated clubs and their registered members, in 2019-20.

The singles championships again this year had the format that the players were marking a game for a round robin section on the first day. This saved clubs trying to find thirty odd markers for the first round.

Southern bowls club has had pennant points taken of them this past season and other clubs have had point awarded to them when they have breached the BTS Conditions of Play for pennant. The Match Committee and Bowls Tasmania South can only apply the rules that are in the BTS Condition of Play and cannot deviate from them. So if you are a club selector you should know the Conditions of Play rules when selecting your teams.

With more competitions being added to the bowls calendar each year and the compulsory pennant break over the Christmas – New Year period, it is almost impossible to run all our southern competitions, so please give a thought when new pennant proposals are talked about, something has to give and changes have to be made for the future of bowls.

## SOUTHERN COACHES PANEL REPORT

Last winter on the first Sunday in each month from May through to September coaching sessions were held at the Howrah indoor centre. On behalf of the coaches that assisted with the training, I would like to thank the Howrah Bowls Club for opening their club on these Sundays and making it available for the coaching sessions and allowing members from other bowls clubs to come and use their indoor centre.

These winter coaching sessions have already been organised for this coming winter and will be again at the Howrah indoor centre starting on the first Sunday of each month in June to September from 12 noon to 3 pm, it is open to everybody from beginners to Premier players. Bowls Tasmania South again is covering the cost of the indoor centre so it is free to all participants at these coaching sessions.

The southern junior boys and girls also had training sessions over the summer month on Friday nights conducted by the southern junior manager and coach at the Buckingham Bowls Club with help from family members.

Our southern coach's committee members are more than happy to travel to any bowls club that needs help in running or organising bowls coaching sessions. If any clubs would like to organise a coaching day all they have to do is contact the southern coaches' panel or myself.

Last year most of our southern coach's certifications have or will expire. It is very simple to be requalified as a club coach by having your bowls club write a current competent letter saying that you have been actively coaching at your bowls club, fill out an application form, supplying a photo copy of your working with vulnerable people card and watch the coaches den videos on the Bowls Australia web site. The recertification fee is \$25.00 to cover the cost of a new certification card. Not many of our coaches in the south have reaccredited which is very disappointing.

There has been three coaches courses run in the south last season with bowlers gaining the coaches certifications so if your bowls club does not have qualified bowls coaches, you need to talk to your clubs committee and arrange to get members qualified. Every bowls club in the south should have at least two female and two male coaches in their club. If you would like to become a coach or know of somebody that would be a good lawn bowls coach please let me know and we can organise your registration through Bowls Tasmania for the next southern club coaches course.

## OFFICIATING' PANEL REPORT

The Bowls Tasmania South Officiating Panel of Helen Ducker, Lee Cowie, Geoff Price and Leonie Price have successfully conducted the business of the Panel during the 2018-19 season.

The Panel conducted meetings at least once every month through the bowling season and appointed Officials for all BTS championship Finals. For the first time the Panel also appointed Markers for BTS Post Sectional Singles events, this initiative is to ensure that singles events had competent markers.

The Side Captain's guidelines will be upgraded for the next season and will include any changes to the Conditions of Play that are relevant to that document. There has still been some misinterpretation of Law A4 page 96 in the Law book (Movement of Players) which has been clarified by Bowls Australia and is incorporated into the Side Captain's Guidelines. There is a section in the Guidelines which directs the Side Captains to ensure that their players are correctly attired as per Bowls Australia and the BTS Conditions of Play.

The Conditions of Play requirement that if there is not a currently accredited umpire at the host club, then a visiting currently accredited umpire must be used has not been followed in some instances.

There was also a reminder to clubs that the Side Captain (Match Manager), the Green Superintendent or nominated representative may not be the Umpire.

The Roles and Responsibilities of Umpires and their Duties have been posted to the Bowls Tasmania South website.

With many thanks to Helen Ducker the Bowls Tasmania South website continued to be updated and clubs are able to access lists of Officials, Measurers and Markers to assist with the conduct of events held at their clubs.

### **Annual Report and Financial Report:**

The President, Peter Kirby, spoke to his report, as published within the Annual Report, and expanded on some points. Moved Peter Kirby Seconded Shirley Hay "that the annual report be received".  
Carried

The Treasurer, Tony Fulton, presented his financial report and the audited financial statements. Moved Tony Fulton Seconded Van Ransley "that the audited financial statements be adopted".  
Carried.

There was some discussion on the cost of producing the Bowls Tasmania Handbook and it was generally agreed that the Handbook in its current printed format is obsolete and that it would save money by just producing the Handbook in an electronic format which could be easily updated during the year as required.

### **Recommendations from the Board:**

**Appointment of Auditor:** Moved Tony Fulton Seconded Doug Lowe "that Rendell Ridge of Max Peck & Associates be re-appointed as auditor".  
Carried.

**Affiliation Fees:** Moved Tony Fulton Seconded Bill Mottershead "that affiliation fees for 2018-19 for adult members be increased by \$4.00 to \$78.00, that the affiliation fee for juniors be increased by \$4.00 to \$42.00, that the registration fee of \$50.00 per team remain unchanged and that entry fees for BTS Championships remain unchanged at \$10.00.

Rob Richardson advised that he was prepared to undertake the duties of Assistant Statistician (Results) for no reimbursement.

### **Timing of BTS Women’s Championships 2018-19:**

The move to Sunday’s for most BTS women’s championship events last season did not result in significant additional entries. It did however result in difficulties in getting clubs to host these events. At the March 2018 Delegates Meeting it was agreed to send this matter back to Clubs to determine whether or not these championship events should revert to during the week rather than Sundays. It was suggested at the Delegates Meeting that the Women’s Singles Championships remain on Sunday’s as the men’s and women’s finals being played together was good. Responses were received from 17 of the 24 Clubs whose members have the opportunity to participate in BTS Women’s Championships. Of these six Clubs preferred weekday championships, five preferred weekday championships with Sunday finals, one Club preferred Sunday championships and five Clubs didn’t mind either way. No responses were received from seven Clubs. The BTS Board has agreed to hold BTS Women’s Championships on weekdays with semi-finals and grand-finals for some of the championships to be played on Sunday’s in conjunction with the BTS Men’s Championships.

### **Starting Time for Midweek Pennant 2018-19:**

At the March 2018 Delegates Meeting, Sorell proposed that the starting time for Midweek Men’s Pennant be changed to 11.30am to ensure an earlier finish and allow players to avoid the growing traffic congestion in Hobart and suburbs. An alternative suggestion put forward at the meeting was a noon start. It was agreed that this matter should be circulated to Clubs that play Midweek Pennant for a decision. Responses were received from 16 of the 18 Clubs that play Midweek Pennant. Of these four Clubs preferred an 11.30am start, five preferred a noon start, nine Clubs preferred a 1.00pm start and two Clubs didn’t mind either way. No responses were received from two Clubs. The BTS Board has agreed that Midweek pennant will remain at a 1pm start but this time can be changed to an earlier start by agreement between the two side captains.

### **Format of Midweek Pennant 2018-19:**

At its meeting on 16 April 2018 the BTS Board determined that Midweek Pennant would revert to twelve players per side next season played as four rinks of triples with at least six B Grade players in each team. Clubs were advised accordingly. The BTS Board has since received correspondence from a number of Clubs seeking to reverse this decision or at the very least to play three rinks of four players instead of four rinks of three players for Midweek Pennant in 2018-19. At its meeting on 21 May 2018 the BTS Board agreed to approach Clubs who play Midweek Pennant to determine their preference for Midweek Pennant for 2017-18.

The BTS Board is still strongly of the opinion that Midweek Pennant should be changed to four rinks of three players playing two bowls triples. The BTS Board would further like to see the game played straight through without a break for afternoon tea. The following supporting information has been provided to Clubs:

- It is inevitable that BTS will in time have been forced to reduce Midweek Pennant to twelve players and not sixteen as is currently the case in just Divisions 1 and 2. Falling numbers of players playing Midweek Pennant has resulted in a number of smaller Clubs simply not being able to field a team of 16 players, resulting in Clubs declining promotion to Division 2 in recent years despite finishing on top of Division 3. In 2017-18 only eight teams played in Division 2 and this situation will only worsen in future years. Whilst survey numbers were not conclusive, the BTS Board decided that Midweek Pennant will consist of twelve players from 2018-19 onwards.
- Midweek Pennant does not lead to State Pennant Finals and BTS has the opportunity to have different Conditions of Play for Midweek Pennant. The BTS Board could have moved to three rinks of four players but decided to think outside the square and introduce something a bit different to bring players more into the game and for bowlers to spend less time waiting to bowl and hopefully generate a bit more interest in the game of bowls. Accordingly it was decided to try two bowl triples which is a quicker game and keeps players more involved than in fours.
- The survey results resoundingly wanted Midweek Pennant to retain its current restrictions in regard to A and B Grade players. The move to twelve players and not sixteen will mean that there may not be two B Grade players in each rink but there will still be a minimum of six (50%) of B Grade players in each side with a minimum of one B Grade player in each rink.
- Whilst Clubs rejected a move to an earlier start for Midweek Pennant next season to ensure an earlier finish and allow players to avoid the growing traffic congestion in Hobart and suburbs, a move to two bowls triples and the BTS decision to play straight through without a break for afternoon tea will achieve the earlier finish outcome sought by some Clubs.
- Players complain that lawn bowls is not progressive and never changes and therefore has difficulty in attracting new players. The BTS Board would like to change the format of Midweek Pennant to try and generate some more interest in the game

The BTS Board has strongly recommended to Clubs that they approve of the change in format for Midweek Pennant to consist of four rinks of two bowl triples next season. Responses are required from Clubs no later than 30 June 2018.

### **Appointment of Office Bearers:**

President: 2 nominations – Peter Kirby and Terry O'Connor. Secretary Rob McGuire assumed the Chair and appointed Life Member Neil Clark as Returning Officer and Bowls Australia's Regional Bowls Manager (Tasmania) Simon Morrison as Scrutineer. Terry O'Connor and Peter Kirby both spoke to the meeting before Delegates were asked to cast their votes. Peter Kirby was duly elected as President. Moved: Ailsa Milburn Seconded: Shirley Hay "that the ballot papers be destroyed".  
Carried

Deputy President: No nominations were received. Nominations were called from the floor but none were received. The position will be filled as a casual vacancy by the BTS Board.
