PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is a pleasure to present to you my annual report to you, a year in which we were almost back to "normal", albeit with some restrictions and additional health and hygiene requirements. To adjust to gatherings indoors some long-standing and traditional activities such as the afternoon tea break could not occur. Again, though, as in my annual report for the previous season, I take great pride in knowing that all clubs in the south of the state adapted to ensure the completion of a very successful season.

On a sad note, it is my duty to acknowledge that Life Member, Tony Fulton OAM, has decided not to seek re-election as BTS Treasurer, a position he has held for the past ten years, and for a total of fourteen years in all. Along the way Tony has also served as BTS Secretary for four years in the early 2000's, and for three of those years serving as BTS Treasurer also. Tony has been an outstanding BTS official having given outstanding and dedicated service to Bowls Tasmania South over many years. Personally, I have appreciated Tony's immense skill in maintaining the Association's finances, as well as his well-considered advice on all matters relating to the management of bowls activity in the southern region of Tasmania. On behalf of all members I wish Tony good health for the future and thank him, sincerely, for his significant contribution and leadership in the sport of bowls.

Since the placement of restrictions on socializing and indoor gatherings, due to COVID-19, from March, 2020, most monthly meetings of the BTS Board have been conducted remotely using Zoom. The Board was successful in its application for a grant which covered the cost of one year's subscription to this video conferencing service. Zoom has also proven to be very helpful in conducting meetings of BTS sub-committees and working groups, such as the review of all BTS policies undertaken by the BTS President and BTS Secretary during the winter months last year. Even though a recent decision was made by the Board not to renew the Zoom subscription when it becomes due the Board has entered into an agreement with Bowls Tasmania to use its Zoom subscription in future should there be a need. Notwithstanding this, Zoom does have available a free service that will enable short meetings of no more than 40 minutes in length to be conducted. This will be of great benefit to the BTS Match Committee, and other sub-committees, that conduct meetings of short duration making an online remote meeting a far more effective use of time for all who participate.

Even though many meetings of the BTS Board have been conducted via video conference this has not had any effect on the efficient operation of the Board in the management of bowls activity in southern Tasmania. New to the Board this year, John McKibben has been a strong advocate of sensible solutions to a number of matters in relation to the conduct of BTS pennant competitions. His input has been thought provoking and challenging at times, but has always contributed to quality decision making. Ross Bannister, in his role of Chair of the BTS Match Committee, has performed his duties admirably.

Leonie Price, formerly the BTS Officiating Panel's nominee on the BTS Board, has spent most of the year as the Board's nominee to fill the vacant ordinary member (female) position on the Board, with Lee Cowie replacing Leonie as the Officiating Panel's nominee. Leonie has continued to be a strong voice on the Board and with Lee has provided quality advice in regard to the interpretation of the Laws of Bowls.

Malcolm Salier is a very effective advocate on the Board for clubs with synthetic greens, as well as for clubs with a smaller membership base. Generally. Malcolm has well-constructed opinions which he uses to good effect in support of the needs and aspirations of those groups, in particular, and has contributed to some lively discussions at meetings of the Board.

Ailsa Milburn, as with BTS Treasurer Tony Fulton OAM, is a source of sound advice to other members of the Board due to her long involvement in the management of bowls in southern Tasmania. Ailsa is a quality asset on the Board due to the corporate memory she is able to bring to discussions and decision making.

Deputy President Pat Zapotocky is a strong advocate for women's issues in the sport of bowls, and displays admirable qualities in being able to separate the requirements of her role as an executive member of the Association from those of her role as president of her club.

The contributions that BTS Secretary, Rob McGuire, makes to the functioning of Bowls Tasmania South are truly amazing and immeasurable. I have a deep regard for Rob's capacity to work on behalf of the Association, as well as the sensible, reasonable and responsible advice he gives to me. He is a strong moderating voice through which he ensures that the decisions he and I make when working together satisfy the best interests of the Association.

As mentioned above, Rob and I worked together on the review of all BTS policies during the winter months of 2020 which were subsequently ratified by the Board. Recent events have given the clearest indication that sometimes what looks good in theory does not stand up to scrutiny when put into practice. Consequently, the BTS Disciplinary Policy and particular rules of the BTS Constitution are under further review in the hope of putting in place, in the near future, compatibility between the policy, the constitution and conditions of play, as well as streamlining processes to ensure that the decisions emanating from disciplinary hearings are made in a more timely fashion.

Player behaviour, lack of respect for officials (umpires) and non-compliance with Bowls Australia uniform policy were matters that were discussed at length at the most recent Bowls Tasmania Regional Consultative Committee meeting in March 2021. The Bowls Tasmania President, Graham Hay, has declared that these matters will be a focus for meetings during the winter months between Bowls Tasmania and the regions to develop consistent approached across all regions. Graham, in particular, is very concerned with the increase in ill-discipline of players during pennant play and has a strong desire to encourage improvement. Hopefully, we are all of the same opinion.

Consistent conditions of play statewide in all three regions seems to become a topic of concern each season on or around the time in which Bowls Tasmania conducts its Saturday State Pennant Finals series, especially when two of the regions conduct four rink competitions and the third conducts a three rink competition. The simple answer is that each region is the controlling body of its pennant competitions and, as prescribed by the Laws of Bowls, is responsible for the conditions of play that govern their domestic (regional) competitions. Each region has developed its conditions of play to meet the needs of the clubs affiliated to the region. When it comes to State Pennant Finals, and Saturday Pennant specifically, Bowls Tasmania is the controlling body and so has responsibility for creating the conditions of play that govern these events, which it has determined to be three rink competitions. This does have an effect for clubs from the south and the north-west that qualify for Saturday State Pennant Finals but most find ways to adapt.

When, in the past, the representatives of the two regions, north-west and south, have participated in Bowls Tasmania sponsored working parties set up to consider consistent state wide conditions of play, each has done so in the firm knowledge of the wishes of the majority of their members, based on the results of surveys each of those regions have conducted in recent times. Whenever the major issue to be resolved has been discussed, whether regional pennant competitions should be three rink events (i.e. 12 players per side), the persons representing Bowls North West and Bowls Tasmania South have voiced a preference for four rink competitions (i.e. 16 players per side) because that is what a clear majority of respondents to surveys in both the North West and the South have preferred. It is at this point that all discussion has ended as there is no possibility of Bowls North ever being able to return to four rink pennant competitions.

It is time that the harassment of Bowls Tasmania officials (i.e. the BTAS President and the Regional Bowls Manager) regarding consistent state wide conditions of play for pennant play ceases. Neither is in a position to foster change in this matter. If individual members want change they should first address the issue through their club board. If clubs want change to conditions of play for domestic competitions (i.e. regional pennant) then they should refer the issue to their regional authority, being BTS in the south.

It is certain that Bowls Tasmania will be making the State Pennant Finals series an issue for discussion at Regional Consultative Committee meetings in the near future. The amount of comment on Facebook during the recent State Pennant Finals series has created a situation where Bowls Tasmania may determine to bring this annual series to an end. No doubt there would be strong feelings about Thursday State Pennant Finals, at least, where there would be grave doubts as to whether this annual competition could ever be made more equitable again in the future. In all likelihood, if this competition continues, sides representing the south and the north-west will be playing each other to determine which one will finish second to the side representing the north. This does not appear to be fair to me. Despite the above, it is with great pleasure that I congratulate Claremont for winning the Saturday Division 1 State Pennant and Glenorchy City for their success in winning the Saturday Division 2 State Pennant in Launceston recently.

A matter of personal satisfaction and the result of five years of effort from BTS has been the change in the way in which Bowls Tasmania will be collecting capitation fees from the regions. Bowls Tasmania will no longer be charging an interim fee then collecting another and final payment late in the season. This model required the payment in full of the per capita fee for every player who registered, whether this occurred pre-season or after pennant play had commenced. This was considered to be a barrier to clubs that sought to introduce new players to pennant after the season had commenced. From now on the regions will be required to pay a single capitation fee to Bowls Tasmania each season, based on the total number of players registered in each region. Each region will then determine how it raises capitation fees from their affiliated clubs. Hopefully, this will incur a single, once-only bulk fee for each club, payable to the region. Each club will have autonomy in the method it uses to raise funds in the form of membership fees from intending pennant players. This should remove an impediment to integrating beginner bowlers to pennant play during the season without the impost of a significant capitation fee having to be paid to Bowls Tasmania.

Congratulations to Michael Taylor, with assistance from Brent Forsyth, for continuing the good work of Ricky Maughan in the provision of a very strong and successful BTS Junior program. Thank you, also, to St Johns Park Bowls Club for making its facilities available to the junior program after its move from its previous base at the Buckingham Bowls Club. The effort put in by Michael and Brent, supported by committed parents and family members, was rewarded with the BTS Junior squad winning the BTS Junior State Wide Challenge for 2020-21, the only southern side to win their State Wide Challenge series this season.

Of course, the success of the BTS Junior program relies on the clubs providing welcoming, safe environments for junior players as well as putting the time in to ensure their initial development. The clubs further support the BTS Junior program by making their junior players available to the program. In no small measure, the ongoing generous support of *Doug Cole* to the BTS Junior program, through his annual donation to the program, contributes immensely to its success. Thank you, Doug, for your significant contribution to the development of our junior players.

With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions both BTS and Bowls Tasmania were able to complete their full range of championship events this season. Congratulations to BTS Bowlers of the Year: Jenny Suttie and Michael Taylor (Open), and Shirley Johnson and Graham Smith (B Grade), for excellent, consistent performances in BTS events over the season. Congratulations also to Crystal Brooks and Barbara Liddington (members of the composite team that won the Bowls Tasmania Women's Open Fours), Bill Mottershead, David Lovett, Ian Salter and Charlie Thomas (winners of the Bowls Tasmania Men's B Grade Fours), Will Coad (member of the composite team that won the Bowls Tasmania Men's Open Triples), Ian Salt and David Lovett (Bowls Tasmania Men's B Grade Pairs), Tony Hack and Leigh Munnings (Bowls Tasmania Senior Men's Pairs winners), Brad Johns (Bowls Tasmania Men's B Grade Singles), Marijke Raine (Bowls Tasmania Women's Disability Singles), Jason Dent (Bowls Tasmania Men's Disability Singles), and Noel Buckingham (winner of the Bowls Tasmania Bowling Arm Singles).

The success of our junior members extended beyond winning the Junior State Wide Challenge with Isaac Maughan indicating his future potential when he partnered with Christine Thompson to win the Bowls Tasmania Open Mixed Pairs championship at Beltana in January 2021. Isaac's success was followed up by Adam Taylor and Riley Davie who monstered their opponents throughout the Bowls Tasmania Junior Pairs event to win this championship convincingly. Seth Harper, on a very fast green at Beltana, won the Bowls Tasmania Junior Boys Singles championship from a gallant Adam Taylor.

In a constrained commercial environment, due to the effects of COVID-19 on local businesses, it has been difficult for BTS to attract sponsorship. Notwithstanding this, Typeface, with some necessary financial adjustment, has sponsored the printing of BTS scorecards for 2020-21. Most pleasing, though, firstly through the efforts of a number of supportive playing members, and then through the diligent efforts of BTS Secretary, Rob McGuire, it was possible to secure the significant financial contribution from a new sponsor, Derwent Eye Specialists, who accepted the naming rights to the BTS Saturday Premier Division. I would encourage all members, when the need arises, to give these generous supporters of the game of bowls in southern Tasmania, first option to provide the required service to you.

The 2020-21 season began with a degree of uncertainty in regard to possible disruptions from further outbreaks of COVID-19 infections, but as the season advanced, and the wider community adapted to new health and safety regimes renewed confidence in players developed and it was gratifying to witness the full program of bowls events for the season being able to reach conclusion. I am particularly pleased with the development of the BTS Men's Midweek competition, especially in the higher divisions, where clubs are now fielding strong sides as more A Grade bowlers are encouraged to participate.

I enjoy the challenge of my role as president of Bowls Tasmania South, and still possess the energy and desire to continue in the position. I am acutely aware of the need for more work to be done, and goals to be achieved and look forward to your support to continue to contribute to the development of the sport of bowls in southern Tasmania.

MATCH COMMITTEE REPORT

The Bowls Tasmania South members of the Match Committee for the 2020-21 season were: Rob McGuire (Buckingham), Rosie Geeves (Howrah), Margaret Cornish (St Johns Park), Paul Hoddy (Cremorne) and Chairperson Ross Bannister (North Hobart).

It was nice to be able to play a full season of bowls and finals after the previous year was called off with no finals being able to be played due to COVID-19 restrictions.

I would like to thank the members of the Match Committee for their help and co-operation throughout the season and Rob McGuire for all the work and his time he does for BTS and the committees he is on, I don't think the bowls community really knows how much Rob does. The Match Committee would also like to thank all the clubs that hosted southern championship events. The Match Committee once again tried to spread the championships around different bowls clubs this season but it was very difficult with a lot of clubs not willing to hold BTS championships. Congratulations to the winners of all of our championships as well as those pennant teams that gained promotion.

Some southern bowls club had pennant points taken of them this season and other clubs have had warnings when they have breached BTS Conditions of Play for pennant. The Match Committee and the BTS Board can only apply the rules that are in the BTS Condition of Play and cannot deviate from them. Several clubs put in complaints this season about green conditions and the speed of the greens. It clearly stated in the BTS Conditions of Play what match managers are supposed to do. If the proper procedures are not followed then the Match Committee has no option but to reject the complaint even if it is valid.

With more competitions being added to the bowls calendar each year, it is almost impossible to run all our southern competitions. Bowls Tasmania and BTS has a competition calendar for the next few years so hopefully this will make it easier to schedule events in the future.

If your club is looking to schedule big events at you club for next season and don't want them to clash with other clubs or bowls south events please ask for proposed fixtures for next season from BTS or get them added to the BTS calendar

COACHES PANEL REPORT

Last winter from May through to September on the third Sunday of the month coaching sessions were scheduled for the Howrah Indoor Centre but, due to COVID-19 restrictions, the first three months had to be cancelled. We were lucky and were able to hold the August session with over fifty people attending on the Sunday and September's session was also held. On behalf of the coaches that assisted with the training, I would like to thank the Howrah Bowls Club for opening their club on these Sundays and making it available for the coaching sessions and Bowls Tasmania South for paying the hire fee thereby allowing bowlers from other bowls clubs to come and use the indoor centre for free.

This winter's coaching sessions will be held again from May to October in 2021on the first Sunday of the month.

The southern junior boys and girls also had training sessions over the summer months on Friday nights conducted by the new southern junior coach Michael Taylor. At the start of the season our junior numbers were down but due to the great organising from their coach and his helpers they recruited players to fill their team and did BTS proud in the state-wide pennant.

I have said this for many years now for some reason lawn bowlers don't want coaching. Maybe it shows up something players can't do on the grass green or the synthetics, whereas in any other sport coaching is a big part of the game.

Our Coached Panel members are more than happy to travel to any bowls club that needs help in running or organising bowls coaching sessions. If any clubs would like to organise a coaching day all they have to do is contact the Coached Panel through BTS.

Most of our southern coach's certification has or will expire this year but it is very simple to be requalified as a club coach by having your club write a current competency letter saying that you have been actively coaching at your club, fill out an application form, supplying a photo copy of your Working with Vulnerable People card and watch the coaches den videos on the Bowls Australia web site. The recertification fee is \$25.00 to cover the cost of a new certification card.

There have been coachers courses run in the south this season with bowlers gaining the coachers certifications so if your club does not have qualified bowls coachers, you need to talk to your club's board and arrange to get qualified. Every club in the south should have at least two female and two male coaches in their club. If you would like to become a coach or know of somebody that would be a good lawn bowls coach please let me know and we can organise your registration through Bowls Tasmania for the next southern club coaches course.

OFFICIATING PANEL REPORT

The Bowls Tasmania South Officiating Panel members are Helen Ducker, Lee Cowie and Leonie Price. The Panel was limited in its activities for the season due to the constraints of the COVID-19 pandemic. However all Bowls Tasmania and Bowls Tasmania South tournaments and events have had Officials appointed at all times.

All Pennant Finals and some of the Preliminary and Semi-finals also had Officials appointed by the Panel.

Once again the Side Captain's guidelines were upgraded for the season and will be done again at the start of the next season.

There is unfortunately an ongoing task to ensure that the Side Captains are aware it is their responsibility for their players to be correctly attired as per Bowls Australia and the BTS Conditions of Play

The Roles and Responsibilities of Umpires and their Duties have been posted to the Bowls Tasmania South website and reminders have been published in the distribution of 'Notes to Umpires'. Umpires need to be impartial in their directions to players and at the same time ensure that 'Duty of Care' is applied.

Lists of Officials, Measurers and Markers are accessible from the BTS website and should be used by Clubs to find Officials for events held at their venue.

The Panel continued to conduct meetings each month through the bowling season and appointed Officials for all BTS Championship Finals. Appointing Markers for BTS Singles Finals and Champion of Champion Championships was successful and again ensured that singles events had competent markers.

Forums for Officials were not conducted but will be reintroduced for the next season.

Thanks go to Ross Bannister for his continuing work on training Measurers, Markers and Umpires. These programs are also now available on-line through the Bowls Tasmania website.

Thanks also to the time and dedication given by Helen Ducker and Lee Cowie.

Finally the Panel would like to thank all the numerous Officials that have given their time to BTS Championship events, Pennant Finals as well as the State Gala Week in January and Thursday State Pennant Finals in April.

MEN'S OPEN SELECTION REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT

Due to several COVID related issues we can report an unplanned excess of income over expenditure in the year under review.

A share of unexpended Bowls Tasmania prizemoney and a grant to ease the cost of the Statewide Challenge contributed to the excess this year.

In addition, an increase in anticipated registrations helped us exceed budget projections. Although still down overall the drop in numbers was less than expected.

Last year Bowls Tasmania subsidized their capitation fee by \$15 for adults and a lesser amount for juniors which allowed BTS to set our membership free at \$80 less the subsidy.

Bowls Tasmania this year has decided to change to a flat fee collection of revenue system and has set the amount to be paid by BTS at \$96,000 including GST. Amounts for the other regions are North \$73,000 and North West \$69,000.

BTS had decided that we need significantly more information on how the flat fee system operates in other states before implementing it here and will retain the individual registration system for the coming year.

BTS will set up a committee to evaluate how the flat fee system operates in other states and how it could be applied here with a view to implementation in 2022-23 after consultation with clubs.

This year without any subsidy we have set the fee at \$83 for adults and \$44 for juniors. This is an increase of \$3 for adults on the 2019-20 fee and we have not increased the juniors' fee from that best in 2019-20.

We have budgeted for a loss of around \$7700 made possible by last year's excess.

Finally, as this is my last report to members as Treasurer may I express my appreciation to Clubs and particularly Treasurers for their cooperation and assistance over the years. It has been a privilege to work with you.
